Comments:

The current draft plan allows much larger group size and herd of stock than has been shown to protect a Wilderness. Group size should be 12 or less and max of 8 head of stock.

Human and stock feces are contaminating the lakes and streams on Beartooth Plateau and in Absaroka-Beartooth Wilderness. If fish stocking was eliminated, then contamination would be decreased, but more measures may be needed. Fish stocking does not fit into "untrammelled by man."

Grazing should be reduced in the Wilderness areas. Closing all the vacant grazing allotments would help.

Trailless areas in the Wildernesses should not have new or reconstructed trails.

Recommended Wilderness areas should have the same rules as an actual Wilderness -- prohibit all motorized and mechanical uses.

I support Alternative D of the Revised Draft Forest Plan with the addition of adding the entire 230,000 acres of the Gallatin Range that are currently in the Recommend Wilderness category.
